



Session 2: Energy offices at the local level: How to develop local energy efficiency, energy poverty and renovation services – obstacles and solutions.

This session will explore best practices on developing energy offices (one-stop-shops) at local level. By drawing upon the Powerpoor and PadovaFIT Expanded projects, the discussion will focus on how to organise an energy office that serves citizens directly, what is needed, how to overcome common obstacles and develop successful practices.
