








The community-based program to tackle energy poverty in Great Besançon Area











Technical assistance context

10 years of existence: more than 1,000 households supported

Increase in the population experiencing energy poverty and the severity of the situations

Persistent difficulties in identification

Increase in public State aid for carrying out energy renovation work

Stagnation or even decrease in requests for renovation assistance

Public aid rarely requested by vulnerable households

Object: improve public policies on financing energy renovation for vulnerable households

Phase 1: Diagnosis

Taking into account the energy costs of the year 2022, the rate of housing in energy poverty in Besançon would be around 30% instead of 14,5%

Results:

Effectiveness of energy poverty tackling policies

- Need to ensure the longevity of this program
- Need to improve the ability to identify households, particularly in rural areas

Areas of improvement

- Identify a support pathway based on the profile of each household and its situation
- Boost the supply of professionals
- Leverage financing tools Action plan









Phase 2: Action plan

- Review the distribution criteria of financial aid of the Metropolis and the pre-finance solutions
 - Internal action by the Metropolis
- Set-up a pre-finance solution for subsidies
 - Partnership action with local stakeholders
- Promote the distribution of eco-loans at 0% interests
 - Action towards professionals (banks)
- Set up a territorial assembler of high-performance renovation (one-stop shop)
 - Internal action by GBM, involving numerous stakeholders




